FRIEDMAN FAMILY VISITING PROFESSIONALS PROGRAM



2015-2016 ACADEMIC YEAR ACTIVITIES REPORT

OBJECTIVES:

The Friedman Family Visiting Professional Program aims to bridge the gaps between the academic and professional worlds of earthquake engineering and earthquake risk reduction by:

- Improving the understanding of students and faculty of the active professional earthquake engineering and risk reduction community;
- enhancing the students' understanding of the multi-disciplinary nature of earthquake engineering;
- Increasing the professional's understanding of the educational process;
- Utilizing the unique intellectual resources of EERI to broker useful relationships; and
- Using the resources of EERI to help students understand and consider professional careers associated with earthquake engineering and earthquake risk reduction.

With generous funding from the Friedman Family endowment, and supplemental support from FEMA in 2015-16, the program sends professionals to universities to provide a lecture and meet with students to discuss the options available to them upon graduation. These meetings also benefit the visiting professionals by increasing their understanding of the educational process experienced by young professionals now entering the field.

2015-2016 PROGRAM OVERVIEW:

The Friedman Family Visiting Professionals program launched in November for the 2015-2016 academic year. The process has led to a refreshed list of visiting professionals, great interest from student chapters, and eighteen scheduled visits by thirteen professionals from February to May 2016.

In early November 2015, EERI staff and the FFVP chair reviewed the budget and clarified the program's operational procedure for the academic year. In this process, the list of visiting professionals was updated and two new professionals were invited to join the program, Elizabeth Hausler Strand and Ron Mayes.

In late November 2015, the program was advertised to EERI student chapters and an application form required student chapters to select their top three professionals and describe the reasons for their choices. Thirty EERI student chapters applied to the program, and eighteen were selected to participate. Selections were made based on the following criteria:

- Budget limitations
- Diversity in professionals selected

- Diversity in universities selected
- Providing opportunities to new chapters or chapters who have not had recent visits.
- Quality of description and reasoning for professionals in application form

Before the first visit in February, EERI staff launched the participating cohort of professionals by hosting a conference call to summarize the procedures and by reviewing the EERI introduction slides that describe EERI's mission, disciplines, and the benefits to students of being a member.

Upon the conclusion of the spring visits, student chapters were required to complete a report summarizing the visit and submit it via a questionnaire designed to solicit their feedback on the success of the program and areas for improvement. The reporting template put in place last year effectively streamlined visit feedback. More timely reporting could be achieved by providing a deadline to student chapters.

- Results, Feedback and Lessons Learned

Visiting professionals were also asked to complete an evaluation that would help EERI staff improve the program. Generally, feedback from the professionals was very good and will help improve our program in the coming academic year. More details about the results of these evaluations are included later in this report.

The only major challenge faced by the chapter was the timeline, since this chapter wanted to arrange for a visit in November so soon after the applications for the program were posted. The chapter reported that this was resolved very smoothly and became a nonissue; and that EERI was very accommodating here.

Since VT's EERI chapter has now hosted seminars in both Geotechnical and Structural fields (and even a presentation on Risk Analysis, outside of the Visiting Professional program), the idea of hosting a seminar on

Seismology seems like it would work well as a marriage between all of these topics. A seminar on Emergency Management would also be a great opportunity, allowing for a more direct inclusion of students interested in social sciences. Generally speaking, we would like to make these visits as inclusive and interactive as possible for students across all fields related to Earthquake Engineering.

2015-2016 OUTCOMES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

The 2015-2016 program achieved great success, as shown in the evaluation forms submitted by both professionals and students.

GOALS, PLANS, AND ACTIVITES FOR 2016-2017 ACADEMIC YEAR

For the 2016-17 academic year the committee plans to schedule at least eight to ten university visits pending a detailed budget assessment.

The University of Massachusetts, Amherst, suggested that it might be useful for them to touch base with other student chapters for guidance on how to make the most of their Friedman visit.

We have had overwhelmingly positive feedback from schools and professionals. Because of our efforts to streamline the application and feedback reporting process for 2014-15, it took less staff time to manage the program in 2015-16. Next year EERI plans to host a call for student chapter leadership. Similar to the professionals call, this will enable more experienced chapters to help mentor and guide chapters in the process as well as share ideas on how to make the most of their Friedman Family visit.
