Mr. Wilson and five other professional guests participated in the 2018 Disaster Preparation Event (DPE), the first large scale event set up by the EERI PSU student chapter. Invited panelist members include the following guests:

An audience of around 200 people arrived at the event, consisting of PSU students, faculty members, representatives from agencies and companies involved with earthquake preparedness, and community members. The event started with the screening of OPS's *Unprepared*, a documentary about the dangers of a

Cascadia subduction zone earthquake and the impact the Portland metro area and the PNW will be facing. The screening of Unprepared ran for an hour before Mr. Wilson and the other panelists were invited on stage for introductions and to take questions.

After the documentary, each of the panelists were introduced to the audience. The panelists were then asked questions in regards to the future prospects of Portland and the PNW before, during, and after a Cascadia earthquake. These questions were submitted from both the audience and from EERI PSU members.

Professional Bio

Jay Wilson is the Clackamas County Resilience Coordinator with the Department of Disaster Management and spearheads the County's efforts to reduce risks and assess hazards including flood, earthquake, wildfire, volcano, and climate change. Mr. Wilson is the past-Chair of the Oregon Seismic Safety Policy Advisory Commission and previously worked for Oregon Emergency Management and as a Mitigation Reservist with FEMA Regions IX and X. He is a member of the Earthquake Engineering Research Institute and has completed post-earthquake reconnaissance trips to Japan and Italy.

SUPPLEMENTAL ACTIVITIES

A meeting was conducted on January 22, 2018 with Mr. Jay Wilson to discuss the DPE.

January 22nd DPE Planning Event

About 3 months before the DPE, EERI PSU met with Mr. Wilson for his input in the event. This meeting set up the framework for the event. Included in the discussion were ideas for how the event can be set up, scheduled, and how the event can gain recognition and be advertised.

After the meeting, Mr. Wilson met with the members of the EERI PSU student group and toured PSU's Engineering Building.

Results, Feedback and Lessons Learned

Having Mr. Wilson's expertise in the panel was essential for the success of this event. Since Mr. Wilson was featured in the OPB documentary *Unprepared*, he was able to speak to the current resiliency plans in place, how municipalities need to prepare for the Cascadia Subduction Zone earthquake, and juxtapose Portland's current efforts to those that have been made in Japan after the Tohoku earthquake in 2011.

- Since Mr. Wilson is a local representative, we believe the public was able to really listen to what he had
 to say. The advice he gave the audience in terms of being involved and in-the-know about the
 Oregon's Resiliency Plan was powerful. It surely made many wanting to be more involved in the
 community.
- Visiting professional lectures are a great way to inform the community about the potential hazards of
 earthquakes. This event has allowed us to plan for the future of our community, and to aspire to
 continue holding community events that provide its citizens with the appropriate resources to prepare
 for a disaster.
